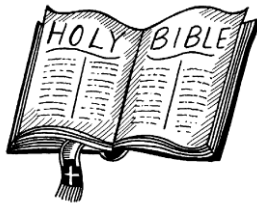
Glory to God on High, and peace to all on earth. We worship you, we give you thanks, our heavenly King. We give you praise, Almighty God and Father blessed in glory bright.

First Reading: EXODUS 3:1-15

A READING FROM THE BOOK OF EXODUS

Moses was keeping the flock of his father-in-law Jethro, the priest of Midian; he led his flock beyond the wilderness, and came to Horeb, the mountain of God. There the angel of the Lord appeared to him in a flame of fire out of a bush; he looked, and the bush was blazing, yet it was not consumed. Then Moses said, "I must turn aside and look at this great sight, and see why the bush is not burned up." When the Lord saw that he had turned aside to see, God called to him out of the bush, "Moses, Moses!" And he said, "Here I am." Then he said, "Come no closer! Remove the sandals from your feet, for the place on which you are standing is holy ground." He said further, "I am the God of your father, the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob." And Moses hid his face, for he was afraid to look at God. Then the Lord said, "I have observed the misery of my people who are in Egypt; I have heard their cry on account of their taskmasters. Indeed, I know their sufferings, and I have come down to deliver them from the Egyptians, and to bring them up out of that land to a good and broad land, a land flowing with milk and honey, to the country of the Canaanites, the Hittites, the Amorites, the Perizzites, the Hivites, and the Jebusites. The cry of the Israelites has now come to me; I have also seen how the Egyptians oppress them. So come, I will send you to Pharaoh to bring my people, the Israelites, out of Egypt." But Moses said to God, "Who am I that I should go to Pharaoh, and bring the Israelites out of Egypt?" He said, "I will be with you; and this shall be the sign for you that it is I who sent you: when you have brought the people out of Egypt, you shall worship God on this mountain." But Moses said to God, "If I come to the Israelites and say to them, 'The God of your ancestors has sent me to you,' and they ask me, 'What is his name?' what shall I say to them?" God said to Moses, "I AM WHO I AM." He said further, "Thus you shall say to the Israelites, 'I AM has sent me to you.'" God also said to Moses, "Thus you shall say to the Israelites, 'The Lord, the God of your ancestors, the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob, has sent me to you': This is my name forever, and this my title for all generations."

A READING FROM THE LETTER OF PAUL TO THE ROMANS

Let love be genuine; hate what is evil, hold fast to what is good; love one another with mutual affection; outdo one another in showing honour. Do not lag in zeal, be ardent in spirit, serve the Lord. Rejoice in hope, be patient in suffering, persevere in prayer. Contribute to the needs of the saints; extend hospitality to strangers. Bless those who persecute you; bless and do not curse them. Rejoice with those who rejoice, weep with those who weep. Live in harmony with one another; do not be haughty, but associate with the lowly; do not claim to be wiser than you are. Consecration of Bishop Elect Edwards

The Consecration of Bishop Elect Edwards will take place on Saturday September 20th, 2014 at 1:00pm at St. Dunstan's Roman Catholic Church in Fredericton, New Brunswick. Seating is limited however it is hoped that all Parishes will be represented. If anyone wishes to attend, registration must be made through the Parish Administrator at 849-8464/847-0850 or 849-3453 **no later than 5 September 2014. Layreaders are invited to Vest to form a procession to St. Dunstan's which will depart precisely 12:40pm. Vesting for Layreaders will take place downstairs in the Cathedral Memorial Hall.** Immediately following the Consecration, a procession of attendees escorted by police and pipes will make its way to Christ Church Cathedral for an out-of-doors reception at approximately 3:00 p.m. In case of inclement weather, the Cathedral Memorial Hall will be a fall back. The Cathedral congregation and Fredericton area parishes will be providing food and beverages and the arrangements for this event.

Installation of the Diocesan:

Bishop Edwards will be installed as the Bishop of Fredericton at the Cathedral that same afternoon at about 4:00 p.m. Again, seating will be limited. The service will be a shortened form of the Welcoming and Seating of a Bishop. Standing room will be available in and around the Cathedral with outside amplification. This may also open the opportunity for those not able to attend the Consecration to be present for the Installation and to greet our new Bishop
